The Malaria Forum is a brainchild of Ifakara Health Institute established in 2011 to highlight on the progress made in the fight against malaria. Ifakara and partners host the annual event, which brings together malaria control stakeholders in Tanzania to have an intellectual discussion on the progress made on various fronts in malaria control.

The Forum design include presentations, panel discussions, and other innovative means to engage policymakers, government officials, parliamentarians, researchers, academicians, multilateral and bilateral funding partners, civil society organizations, journalists, and members of the public in a meaningful way.

The event will be held on Tuesday, April 30, 2024 from 8:00 am - 6:00 pm at the White Sands Hotel in Dar es Salaam, Tanzania.

As usual, this is a one-day forum which will bring together key stakeholders, including representatives of government ministries, research regulatory bodies, research and academic institutions, investors, innovators, and other relevant entities, to engage in discussions and collaborative efforts towards the goal of eliminating malaria.

Sponsored by the Swiss Embassy in Tanzania, the forum will provide a platform for sharing insights, experiences, and best practices in malaria control and elimination. It will focus on exploring strategies for sustainable investment, leveraging innovation in research and technology, and implementing effective interventions to combat malaria.



OVER **60**YEARS OF IMPACT ON PUBLIC HEALTH

A visit to Ifakara by Swiss zoologist Prof. Rudolf Geigy in 1949 marked the beginning of over 60-year history of IFAKARA. Geigy [1920-1995], sought a fieldwork location for researching on tropical diseases. Eight years later, he opened the Swiss Tropical Institute Field Laboratory (STIFL) there. The name "Ifakara" refers to "a place you go to die", a reflection of the historically high burden of disease in the area, before major control efforts started.

In the years after the 1961 independence, STIFL played a central role in training medical officers who could serve the country after independence. The Government of Tanzania mandated the STIFL to play the role.

In 1996, IFAKARA was made a trust and renamed, 'Ifakara Health Research and Development Centre (IHRDC). This name lasted until 2008 when it was changed to the current one of Ifakara Health Institute.

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
